Section 6 - Guidelines

1. About the program

The objective of this assistance measure made under agreements between the Commonwealth and State Governments, is to support the recovery of primary producers impacted by the January - February 2019 Queensland Flood Disaster (Eligible Disaster).

The North and Far North Queensland Flood Special Disaster Recovery Grants provides a grant to primary producers to help pay for the costs of clean-up and reinstatement of primary production enterprises that have suffered direct damage as a result of the Eligible Disaster.

2. Available Funding

2.1 The maximum grant amount for clean-up and reinstatement activities is \$75,000.

2.2 Should an initial application be less than the maximum grant amount, further applications may be submitted if additional expenditure is required to complete clean-up and reinstatement activities.

3. How funding may be used

3.1 Grants are provided for the clean-up and reinstatement of primary production enterprises impacted by direct damage from the eligible disaster.

4. Eligibility criteria

4.1 To be eligible for the grant, the applicant must:

- be a primary producer;
- hold an Australian Business Number (ABN) and have held that ABN at the time of the disaster;
- have a primary production enterprise that is located in the defined area for the eligible disaster that has suffered direct damage as a result of the eligible disaster;
- have been engaged in carrying on the primary production enterprise when affected by the eligible disaster.

4.2 An applicant may also be eligible for a grant if both of the following apply:

- The applicant's primary production enterprise is located outside the defined disaster area for the eligible disaster but is carried on at least sometime on a regular basis in the area.
- Plant or equipment of the primary production enterprise situated in the defined disaster area has been damaged or livestock deceased as a result of the eligible disaster.

5. Evidence of direct damage

- Photographs of damage - photographs evidencing direct damage.
- Other evidence - in addition to photographs, you can also provide other evidence such as quotes, estimates or tax invoices (if available) that demonstrates the impacts as a result of the eligible disaster.

6. Eligible separate businesses

6.1 Applicants who operate more than one primary production enterprise, for example under a single ABN at separate locations, may apply for assistance for each eligible separate business up to the maximum amount of assistance available for the relevant defined disaster area and determined by the establishment notice

6.2 When determining an eligible separate business QRIDA may consider (but is not limited to):

- the staffing arrangements of the separate property;
- whether the property has its own plant equipment or stock;
- the accounting arrangements of the separate property;
- whether the separate property operates under its own trading name;
- the commercial scale, viability and autonomy of each property.

Section 6 - Guidelines (continued...)

7. Definitions

Primary producer means:

- a) a sole trader who spends the majority of their labour on, and derives the majority of their income from a primary production enterprise (or can demonstrate the production potential to eventually derive the majority of their income); or
- b) in relation to a partnership, company or trust that carries on a primary production enterprise, the partners in the partnership, shareholders in the company or beneficiaries of the trust who spend the majority of their labour on, and derive the majority of their income from, the primary production enterprise (or can demonstrate the production potential to eventually derive the majority of their income);

Primary production enterprise means:

- a) a business that is carried on by a primary producer and involves primary production, including the agricultural, apicultural, aquacultural, commercial wild-catch fishing, forestry, grazing and horticultural industries; and
- b) for which an entity holds an Australian Business Number (ABN).

 - iii. information collected by QRIDA or its authorised representatives under paragraph (a) above
 - iv. information about any previous application I/we have made to, or financial assistance received from, QRIDA.

I/We authorise any Relevant Person to disclose to QRIDA and its authorised representatives such information as may be requested about me/us in connection with this application.

If you make a subsequent application for a Special Disaster Assistance Grant the total assistance cannot exceed the maximum \$75,000 available under the eligible disaster event.
